The first regular meeting of the Dixon County Board of Supervisors for the year 2019 convened at 9:00 A.M. for reorganization in the Jury Room in the Dixon County Courthouse in Ponca, Nebraska on January 8, 2019. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Notice was given to the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Law. On roll call, members present were: Myron Fleury, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Lisa Lunz, William Koch and Greta Kraemer. Absent: None. Also present were Cindy Purucker, Dixon County Clerk and Secretary to the Board of Supervisors and other interested persons.

Motion was made by Blohm, seconded by Mackling to appoint Greta Kraemer as Temporary Chairman. On roll call vote, Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Myron Fleury, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Greta Kraemer, William Koch and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Kraemer abstained.

Part-time Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and County Engineer Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian McDonald updated the Board on the progress on the Wakefield NW bridge and the Emerson bridge. He has received estimates from FEMA on the Emerson bridge and will be ready to let the bridge in early spring.

Supervisor Fleury left the meeting at 9:50 A.M.

Dixon County's 2019 One and Six Year Road Improvement Plan was discussed. Public Hearing on the Plan was set for February 12, 2019 at 9:15 A.M. on a motion by Koch and second by Mackling. On roll call vote, M.C. Absent: Fleury.

Pay Application from Theisen Construction for materials on the Wakefield NW project was approved on a motion by Blohm and second by Nicholson. On roll call vote, Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Myron Fleury, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Greta Kraemer, William Koch and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. The engine braking resolution was not available to discuss.

Chad Kneifl was present to discuss the interlocal agreement regarding snow removal for Daily Township. Chad also discussed the possibility of grading in the future since they don't have a grader or operator. He and Supervisor Kraemer will get together and go over the roads that need opened.

Robert Wegner read a statement to the Board regarding the circumstances leading up to his disciplinary action. Robert questioned who his direct supervisor was and who had the authority to discipline him. He was appealing his work suspension and asked the Board to reconsider and reinstate his wages.

Sarah Roberts with Nebraska Extension was present to give the Board an update on Extension programs and concerns. Barbara Junck has retired and Monica Ebmeier has taken her place. Keith Jarvi's position has not been filled yet. There are three (3) members going off the Extension Board so they will be advertising for new members.

Shea Scollard was appointed as primary rep. and Lynn Kuehl as alternate rep. to the North East Regional Governance Board for the North East Planning, Exercise, Training & Interoperable Communications Region on a motion by Koch and seconded by Kraemer. Lynn Kuehl gave an update on the communications tower. The shelter is coming on Thursday so she can have the electrician come and hook everything up. She is currently coordinating climb crews to do maintenance on the north and south towers and to have the equipment installed on the new tower.

The Emergency Manager Performance Review for EMPG grant guidelines were tabled until next month so the Board could look them over.

Clyde Flowers, Dixon County Surveyor was present to talk to the Board about being re-appointed as County Surveyor.

Mike Skroch and Tim Gabel, Landmark Surveying were present to show interest in the County Surveyor appointment. They told of their qualifications and gave a breakdown of their rates.

The Dixon County Historical Society presented a report of the expenses for the last six months.


The County Treasurer's Six-Month Report was reviewed.





The new system would be universal and work with all makes. Sara had locations mapped where existing cameras are and where new ones should be placed for better coverage. Sheriff Taylor recommended that a couple Board members look at our current system and the Ponca School has given permission for them to look at their system.

A motion was made by Mackling, seconded by Nicholson to take bids for the old Christmas lights. Larry Lueders approached the Board about three -12" culverts that have been installed in creek in a field by a private party. The Board advised Mr. Lueders to talk to the Corps of Engineers since the tubes were put into a creek.

Supervisor Koch thought he could save the county money by putting down aggregate and pouring a new floor a few inches higher on top of the old floor. In the

process he would remove the old boiler, move the generator and electric box. Chair Lunz told him to get an estimate for his plan and we would have Thrasher come and give a short presentation of their process and answer any questions. The Board will then make a decision as to which plan would be more cost effective.





Chair Lisa Lunz opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and called for roll call of members present. Also present were Cindy Purucker, Dixon County Clerk and Secretary to the Board of Supervisors and other interested persons. Chair Lunz gave notice to the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Law.

Motion was made by Koch, seconded by Blohm to show that this meeting was preceded by due and legal notice by posting as required by law in the Bank of Dixon County, bulletin board in the lower hall of the courthouse, bulletin board in the County Clerk's office and two County newspapers, and all Board Members were notified simultaneously and the agenda of all know business to come before the Board of Supervisors was posted in the office of the County Clerk. On roll call vote, Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Greta Kraemer, William Koch and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Motion was made by Blohm, seconded by Mackling to approve the minutes of the last meeting as written. Dixon County Engineer, Brian McDonald and Highway Superintendent Arnold Mellick were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian McDonald updated the Supervisors on the Emerson North project. It is still under FEMA review at this time. As soon as funding is approved the Board will need to authorize the County Clerk to advertise for bids. Federal Highway (FWHA) will be in charge of the damaged bridge on the county line north of Emerson, not FEMA because it's on a federal funded road. The bridge west of Martinsburg has severe head cut and has lost dirt & rock because of the flooding. There are more than 12 sites that have significant damage to roads and bridges. Culverts and bridges on Elk Creek and Lime Creek have had damage. A culvert on 589 Avenue west of Waterbury turnoff will need considerable repairs or replaced. There is a major phone cable there that will need to be moved or rerouted before work can begin. District #3 is looking into the EWP (Emergency Watershed Program) and applying through NRCS for money. We have a 60 day window to apply. This is for protection of public structures. If repairs are not made within a timely manner the structures could be lost.

Alan Bauman, Dixon County Ag Society, was present to share the plans for the 2019 Dixon County Fair. The fair will be held Wed. July 31 through Sunday, August 4th. Alan also updated the Board on who is on the Dixon County Ag Society Board.

Emergency Manager, Shea Scollard discussed the 2019 flooding and other emergency duties. He is working with some of the townships about their flood damage and helping them prepare FEMA paperwork. If the townships have had flood damage they need to contact Shea. Money from last year's 2018 flood is starting to be distributed and we should be receiving it in increments. Shea met with Lisa Lunz, Terry Baxter, NIRMA and Cindy Purucker, County Clerk regarding the Emergency Plan for the County Courthouse. Lynn Kuehl, 911 director told the Board that there had been a Code Red alert of a 911 communication line cut and Cedar County 911 had to be redirected to Dixon County. There had been another line cut during the flood but that was fixed permanently and not just patched. Tower grant money has been received and repaid to the Inheritance Tax Fund. Lynn has started the GEO Com addressing system.

A motion was made by Nicholson to approve the agreement with Tom Hansen, CPA, for accounting services for Disaster DR4420. Seconded by Mackling. On roll call: Supervisors voting in favor of said motion





were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Greta Kraemer, William Koch and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

A motion was made by Kraemer to appoint Shea Scollard as the authorized representative for Dixon County regarding disaster DR4420. The motion was seconded by Koch. 

Brian stated that the contractor is ready to move in to the Wakefield West bridge project. He touched on other projects that are coming up, a collapsed culvert in District 7, Emerson North Bridge has been advertised for bids. The Bengston Bridge was discussed on how we want to proceed in repairing the bridge or replacing it. Brian will be meeting with the Corps of Engineers on permitting for the repairs for headwall cutting. FEMA has not gone out to assess the flooded sites yet. They are behind because of the magnitude of claims. The EWP program through NCRS has been applied for. Site visits were done last week with Greta and Arnie. We should hear in 10 to 14 days what sites will be approved.

Philip Jensen with Great Plains Communications was present to discuss our phone and internet contract. He gave us options to upgrade our service that may be less expensive. A motion was made by Blohm and seconded by Andersen for the Chair to sign 60-month contracts with Great Plains for a PRI Bundle and standard internet services. An Active Shooter drill was held at the Wakefield School. NRCS and County Road maps are being updated. Some FEMA money came in from last year's flooding with more to come. He is currently waiting on FEMA inspectors to evaluate the 2019 flood damage.

Lynn Kuehl, 911 Coordinator and Deputy Emergency Manager updated the Board on the communication tower progress. Antennas are being installed and the tower should be up and running by the end



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of May. A fence needs to be installed around the tower. The antennas will need to be uninstalled from the SBI tower. Lynn is currently working on GEO Spatial 911 addressing. The 911 address signs for the wind towers will be installed soon. Berry Beldin will be asked to help put up the new 911 address signs.

Sara Kumm updated the Board on the panic alarm system. NIRMA has given a full cost grant to pay for all of the panic alarms. A motion was made by Kraemer to authorize Sara to order the panic alarm system. Seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Greta Kraemer, and Lisa Lunz. Supervisors voting against: None. Those residents wanted to know what it would take for the County to take over their road. Chair Lunz stated that the subdivision is on private property and according to the covenant and an agreement with the City of Ponca the sub-divider is responsible for the roads within the subdivision. County Attorney Leland Miner asked the residents why they had not approached the City of Ponca about being annexed since they are within the one-mile extraterritorial jurisdiction for their zoning regulations. There were numerous complaints by the subdivision residents about getting taxed for no services. They stated they were told by a couple of supervisors they were going to get help. County Attorney Leland Miner suggested they develop a home owners association and assessing the cost to each homeowner for the cost of gravel and maintenance of the roads. Lynn presented updated the Board on the communications tower. The tower is functioning and went live on Memorial Day. A fence needs to be installed around the tower site. She will get bids on the fence. She met with Motorola to see what we need to join the statewide radio system.

Sara Kumm presented the Board with a draft of the Emergency Plan for fire and tornado drills. The plan will be submitted to the Safety Committee to look over.

Sara is also getting quotes on door replacement for the FOB System. When she gets the quotes, she will send in the grant paperwork for the FOB System.

The residents from Dakota View Subdivision was represented by Chris Keller, Kenton Book and Chris Logue. They have developed an informal Home Owners Association. They approached the Board with a proposal to have the County make a county road of .6 miles from Spur 26E to the center of the development. Their concern is for children getting on & off the bus on the highway among other issues. They feel that their tax base for the subdivision is sufficient incentive for a county road. County Attorney Leland Miner asked if a survey had been done, also how much right of way and how wide the road was. There is 60' of right of way and the roads they thought were 28' wide. There are no bridges and 1 culvert.





Chair Lunz gave notice to the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Law.

Motion was made by Blohm, seconded by Nicholson to show that this meeting was preceded by due and legal notice. On roll call vote by posting as required by law in the Bank of Dixon County, bulletin board in the lower hall of the courthouse, bulletin board in the County Clerk's office and two County newspapers, and all Board Members were notified simultaneously and the agenda of all know business to come before the Board of Supervisors was posted in the office of the County Clerk. The County budget was reviewed and discussed, and the County Clerk was directed to publish the Notice of Budget Hearing.







Notice of the meeting was provided by posting same at the Dixon County Courthouse, at the Bank of Dixon County in Ponca, Nebraska, and on the bulletin board in the United States Post Office in Ponca, Nebraska, during regular business hours on Thursday, September 12, 2019. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Terry Nicholson, Greta Kraemer, and Lisa Lunz. Supervisors voting against: None. Absent: Alan Mackling & William Koch.

Chair Lunz announced that the purpose of the emergency meeting was to discuss whether the Board of Supervisors should approve the relocation of 5835 Road south of Highway 20. Since it would be too late to vote on the issue at the regular October meeting of the Board, and since there was no time to call a special meeting for that purpose due to the same time constraints, it was necessary to call the emergency meeting.

The State of Nebraska is moving the intersection of 5835 Road to accommodate the expansion of the bridge and guardrails on Highway 20 to the west 175 feet. The area where the partial road reconstruction on 5835 Avenue would connect with the existing road would cause a corner to be very close to the unstable creek bank.

Supervisor Greta Kraemer proposed to move 5835 Avenue straight south 1500 feet from the proposed new intersection with Highway 20 instead of winding around and connecting to the creek. This would eliminate a number of curves, the flooding road and avoid the unstable creek bank.

Matthew Samuelson, NDOT, stated that there are three scenarios that would be available.

- 1. Leave the NDOT plans as they are.
- 2. NDOT does all the work and the County pays for the difference over what was budgeted for that phase of the project.
- 3. The County does all the work to move the road and the state would share the cost with the County.

If the changes are approved by NDOR, the State needs to do an environmental impact study regardless which change scenario is used. This could delay the State's project two to three months. At this point the project is ready to be handed over to be let in January. Mr. Samuelson stated he would know a lot more in the next week or two what is feasible to change and still keep the project on track.

A motion was made by Supervisor Kraemer that the County is willing to relocate the road on 5835 Avenue south of Highway 20 west of its current location. The County will move the road at its own expense and is willing to enter into a cost share agreement with the State of Nebraska. Seconded by Nicholson. On roll



call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Terry Nicholson, Greta Kraemer, and Lisa Lunz. Supervisors voting against: None. Absent: Alan Mackling & William Koch.

Dixon County Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and County Engineer Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects.

Brian informed the Board that the design is done on Martinsburg SW, the road realignment project on south 583.5 Ave. DOT requires that federal guidelines be followed in acquiring right of way. Another appraisal will need to be done. Work will probably not be able to start until spring on the project. Brian will continue to work with NDOT on right of way procurement and the environmental study.

Brian has been in contact with Jason at NRCS on the EWP flood projects. The projects are in the environmental phase, permitting needs processed also.

Brian stated that Site 11 on the 2018 flooding needs extended 15' to 20' to eliminate the headwall. The Newton and Gardner Growers culverts have been surveyed. JEO's environmental department has been sent out to look at it. Some tree removal will need to be done. The federal aid bridge north of Emerson on the county line is waiting on FHWA documents. The bridge closed signs have been pulled down and run over.

The fracture critical bridge NW of Allen was closed by the state bridge inspectors. The bridge needs a deadman to pull the bridge back, just welding won't hold well enough. It was noted that someone knocked down the signs and ruined them. The sheriff's office was called to report the incident. Other closed bridges have had the same thing happen.

Mike Krusemark, Krusemark Construction & Excavation, was present to discuss problems with the culvert project. Brian McDonald suggested that he dewater the site and it was up to Mr. Krusemark to figure out how to do it. Mr. McDonald was not against installing geogrid to drain the area. Mr. Krusemark was directed to work with Brian and find a solution as this has taken three months to replace a tube.

Terry Nicholson joined the meeting at 9:45 A.M.

Chad Kneifl and Kevin Lunz were present to discuss an agreement with Daily Township for snow removal on their roads. The amount the County will charge is being calculated and will be discussed at the December meeting. Chad was directed to try and contact Clark Township and see if they could hire their blade operator to help with snow removal.

Charla Nedge with Goldenrod Regional Housing was present to explain the transferring of jurisdictions of Northeast Nebraska Joint Housing to Goldenrod Regional Housing. Northeast Nebraska Joint Housing

submitted a request to HUD to transfer to Goldenrod Regional Housing. Charla asked the Board to approve the resolution transferring jurisdiction to Goldenrod Regional Housing.




