DIXON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS PROCEEDINGS

The first regular meeting of the Dixon County Board of Supervisors for the year 2021 convened at 9:00 A.M. for reorganization in the Jury Room in the Dixon County Courthouse in Ponca, Nebraska on January 12, 2021. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Notice was given to the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Law. The following constitutes the Dixon County Board of Supervisors for 2021:

On roll call, members present were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Lisa Lunz, Deric Anderson and Roger Peterson. Absent: None. Also present were Cindy Purucker, Dixon County Clerk and Secretary to the Board of Supervisors and other interested persons.

Lisa Lunz, Chair of the 2020 Board asked for a motion to appoint a Temporary Chair. Motion was made by Andersen, seconded by Nicholson to appoint Neil Blohm as Temporary Chairman. On roll call vote, by posting as required by law in the Bank of Dixon County, bulletin board in the lower hall of the courthouse, bulletin board in the County Clerk's office and two County newspapers, and all Board Members were notified simultaneously and the agenda of all know business to come before the Board of Supervisors was posted in the office of the County Clerk. Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Blohm abstained. Absent: None.

Temporary Chairman Blohm asked for nominations from the Board for Chairman for 2021. Motion was made by Terry Nicholson to nominate Lisa Lunz, Alan Mackling made a motion to nominate Neil Blohm. Don Andersen made a motion for nominations to cease, seconded by Alan Mackling. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Motion was made by Blohm, seconded by Andersen to approve the Committees for 2021. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. The person whose name heads the list of each Committee is designated as the Chairman of that Committee (23-272).

The regular meeting of the Board shall be held on the second Tuesday of January. All other meetings are adjourned meetings.

Part-time Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and County Engineer Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian McDonald updated the Board on the progress on the Emerson North FHW bridge. They are at the Plan-In-Hand stage. A meeting with the Dakota County Highway Supt. will be held on the Burcham bridge. That project should be let next month. EWP projects need a sight visit. He will find out next week if we were awarded any bridge match funds.

Supervisor Mackling had Husker Steel look at bridge 2905P. They said for now it is good.

Shea Scollard, Emergency Manager, stated that we had been reimbursed for almost all of the FEMA projects.





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Motion by Mackling, seconded by Blohm to appoint Shea Scollard as Emergency Manager and Sara Kumm as 911 Director. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Resolution and Ordinance Book 3 Page 3.

Shea Scollard was appointed as primary rep. and Sara Kumm as alternate rep. to the North East Regional Governance Board for the North East Planning, Exercise, Training & Interoperable Communications Region and a Memorandum of Understanding for the Northeast Region Planning Committee approved on a motion by Nicholson and second by Andersen. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. The Emergency Management Performance Review for EMPG grant guidelines were tabled until next month. They will be completed by Chair Lunz after interviews are completed.

Shea Scollard and Sara Kumm were present to give Emergency Management Updates. Shea updated the Board on the FEMA and Cares Act reimbursement. So far, we have recovered about \$850,000.00, we are still waiting on money for the Martinsburg SE project.

Sara Kumm informed the Board that in-car camera installation and training will be completed by the end of January. GeoComm mapping is up and running. It was well received by the dispatchers. NextGen 911, the regional 911 system, interlocal agreement is almost completed. Norfolk and South Sioux City will be the main hubs. The security cameras have all arrived except for one. They will be installed later this month. The USDA grant for security doors is on hold due to COVID-19. The contractor is having difficulty with the door manufacturer. We may have to look elsewhere for a door manufacturer. The Cedar County 911 back-up paging equipment will be installed this month. COVID-19 vaccinations are progressing. All law enforcement, fire and rescue personnel have been vaccinated. They will be moving to the next phase.

A grant for \$3,500.00 to defray the cost the body cams was received.

The loan agreement for the in-car cameras was discussed. Motion was made by Peterson, seconded by Blohm to sign the agreement. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Patrick Strizek from Motorola was unable to attend and address the Board. He will be here next month.

Safety Committee recommendations were submitted. Moving the fuel tanks from inside the road sheds to the outside. Supervisor Peterson talked with Tim Baxter at NIRMA and he stated that they are no longer allowed inside a building. There is a grant available to help with the expense of moving the fuel tanks and purchasing new tanks. Supervisor Peterson will ask Sara Kumm to help him write the grant for moving the fuel tanks. The south shed would like safety jackets for winter wear. The board denied the request as the road employees have vests that are sized adequately to wear over their coats. The south shed also stated that there are 2 trucks that don't have heaters or defrosters. The supervisors for the south shed said they are trucks that are only to be used in the warmer months. There would be no need to repair the heaters.

Rozanne Hintz was appointed to represent Dixon County on the Northeast Nebraska Area on Aging Advisory Board for a 3-year term on a motion made by Mackling and second by Peterson. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The Board recessed to meet as Board of Equalization and reconvened with all members present. Application from Bank First and NPAIT to be approved as a County Depository for 2021 were reviewed. Motion was made by Peterson, seconded by Andersen to adopt resolutions approving Bank First, Wakefield, NE and NPAIT as County Depositories for 2021. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors

The Sheriff's office presented a resolution for a fee schedule recommended by the State Auditor's office. Supervisor Nicholson made a motion to sign the resolution for the Sheriff's fee schedule, seconded by Andersen. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Motion was made by Andersen and seconded by Anderson to approve and sign the Resolution and Interlocal Agreement with Region IV Behavior Health. On roll call vote: Motion carried. The Audit Report was reviewed and is on file in the County Clerk's Office.

Ken Beaudette, Murphy Tractor, talked to the Board about the JD Link system. The new maintainer will be delivered next week. He also shared that there are management classes available for training a road foreman.

The Board made their quarterly tour of the jail.

The Board recessed for lunch at 12:00 P.M and reconvened at 1:00 P.M with all members present.

Randi Hale, NMC, stated that the backhoe will be delivered next week.

County Attorney, Leland Miner was present to discuss legal concerns of the Board.

Discussion was had whether a township can have a private individual maintain township roads. Tim Baxter from NIRMA told Roger Peterson that there would need to be a signed contract and the individual would have to be bonded. The Township and the County should enter into an Interlocal Agreement. The County Attorney will write a letter to the township and advise the township that they can't just turn over a township road to a private party.

Mowing road done by the County on the north end will end. Landowners are responsible for mowing their roads. The only time mowing will be done is when it is late in the year and there is a chance of snow drifting onto the roadway. Landowners will be notified there has been a change in policy.

Supervisor Deric Anderson was notified by NPPD they were going to be replacing transmission lines from the intersection of 863 Rd and 585 Avenue south for four miles on 585 Ave & then west one mile on 859 Rd to Highway 9. NPPD wanted to know if we had any projects in that area. Deric will contact NPPD and tell them no projects are scheduled for that area at this time.

The County Treasurer was authorized to invest monies not needed for day-to-day operations in bonds, etc. on a motion by Blohm and second by Mackling. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The mileage reimbursement rate change to .56 cents per mile effective January 1, 2021 was approved on a motion by Nicholson and a second by Mackling. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The Sheriff's 2020 Activity Report was reviewed.

The County Treasurer's Six-Month Report was reviewed.

The Annual Jail Standards Evaluation was discussed. An annual evaluation of the jail was conducted to determine its compliance with the Nebraska Minimum Jail Standards. The Dixon County facility was determined to be in full compliance at the time of inspection.

The Noxious Weed deposited \$701.00 last month.





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The County Official's Fee Reports and Treasurer's List of Pledged Securities were approved on a motion by Blohm and second by Nicholson. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Discussion was had on entering interlocal agreements with the townships.

Hiring a road foreman was discussed. A job description needs to be developed along with duties to be performed and what we want to pay for a salary.

Motion was made by Nicholson, seconded by Peterson to show that this meeting was preceded by due and legal notice by posting as required by law in the Bank of Dixon County, bulletin board in the lower hall of the courthouse, bulletin board in the County Clerk's office and two County newspapers, and all Board Members were notified simultaneously and the agenda of all know business to come before the Board of Supervisors was posted in the office of the County Clerk. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Supervisors voting against: None. County Engineer Brian McDonald was present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian reported that the Bridge Match was awarded and they will pay up to \$200,000.00 on the Newcastle SW project. He stated the surveys are done on the EWP projects and will be meeting with NRCS to discuss designs. Brian is going to schedule the ones that we don't need right-of-way on first. Emerson North (Krusemark county line bridge) should be let on February 22nd. Emerson North #1 (Federal Aid Bridge on the county line) is set for a meeting with the Dept. of Transportation this Thursday. The bridge design has been approved they are waiting on permitting and right-of-way.

Brian stated that he is hoping to get a determination from FEMA on the value damage appeal this week. Once an alternate project is assigned it will determine the amount of compensation. The Echtenkamp bridge is scheduled for survey. The south bridge at Schutte's will be surveyed for a culvert. The north bridge at Schutte's will be re-sheeted.

The Board discussed the agreement with NDOT on a temporary road closure and detour between Cedar and Dixon Counties for Project D3 (107) for improvements on Highway 116 at Dixon. Motion was made by Mackling to sign the agreement and resolution, seconded by Peterson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Gene Watchorn and Mike Brennan from Ponca Township and Rick Verzani were present to discuss the maintenance of 878 Road approximately 1 ½ miles from Highway 12 to Verzani Farms lay down yard. County Attorney Leland Miner stressed the importance of having a written agreement between the township and Mr. Verzani to protect both the township and the land owner for liability purposes. It was suggested from the County Engineer, Brian McDonald that the township have some control of the type of gravel that is used, the amount of maintenance to be done and bond from Verzani Farms. County Attorney Miner stated that he would draw up an agreement for the Township Board and Mr. Verzani to approve and sign.

Patrick Strizek and Brandon Winchester from Motorola were present to answer questions regarding the Nebraska Statewide Radio system. The current system was installed in 2015 or 2016. We are currently six (6) updates behind. The equipment has to be updated by the end of this fiscal year to continue to have maintenance coverage on it. The cost to update our current dispatch equipment is going to be very costly. The Statewide





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Radio System is available in Dixon County. The current mobile units and portables the deputies carry are SRS compatible. Also, the NextGen911 system is coming in 2022 and will require to have the SRS. With the SRS the deputies would have direct communications with Nebraska State Patrol, Nebraska Game and Parks, and other law enforcement personnel without going through multiple dispatch centers. Joining the SRS would include our current system to be on the same maintenance as the state for upgrades every two years automatically, will have equipment protection if anything would break, and will cost less for our share of the yearly maintenance agreement.

Shea Scollard, Emergency Manager, told the Board that the FEMA money was received for the Martinsburg SE project. He had to resend the FEMA application for the COVID materials. The addressing project will be completed this week. He is currently working on getting ID badges for the teacher's unification site. He has been in contact with the fire chiefs regarding communications and needs they may have.

Sara Kumm, 911 Director, updated the Board on COVID vaccinations. They are set up every other week in Dixon County. We are currently in phase 1b which includes seniors 65 and older. Everyone must register online. She is currently trying to get permission from the Health Dept. to put notices in the newspapers and on the radio. She submitted a NIRMA grant for high visibility coats for the road crew. The grant will be reviewed in November. The in-car and body cameras have been installed and are working. Sara has been working with Supervisor Peterson on the FOBs and security doors.

Sara gave the Board a copy of the Interlocal Agreement for the Regional 911 system. The County Attorney has already looked it over and gave his approval. The agreement will be placed on the agenda for March.

The Board recessed to meet as Board of Equalization, and reconvened with all members present. Absent: None.

The next Dixon County shot clinic will be March 16^{th at} the Salem Lutheran Church in Ponca. The 911 addressing project is completed. NextGen 911 was discussed, we are the only county that has almost completed the project. There was a tabletop discussion with area schools about a 2-day training in Ponca developing an Emergency Plan. Shea stated that he has attended some fire meetings and has three scheduled for this month. Tornado spotter training is going to be online again this year. Weed shop and Road shop evacuation plans are completed. 911 Coordinator, Sara Kumm, will plan on a tornado drill in April. She stated that the Interlocal agreement for Regional 911 is going to change. South Sioux City and Norfolk will be the 2 main hubs. Dixon County will have less equipment on site. Discussion was had on the bullet proof doors. The bid came in for over \$200,000.00 which does not include FOBS. In order to execute the FOB system, we would need to install the doors. The upgrade will take approximately 4-5 hours to complete. Cedar County will be covering the emergency calls for that time. The FCC has to approve the amendment for paging and tornado sirens. The NextGen911 interlocal agreement is waiting on Pierce and Thurston Counties consent. Thurston County is not sure if they will be joining. We can use 100% of our set aside money to pay for it. The Statewide Radio System equipment and pricing has been finalized. With the current equipment we have we are 6 versions behind. It would cost \$434,973.00 to upgrade our current program. If we switch to the Statewide Radio System it would cost \$242,202.96 and the state is responsible for the upgrades and maintenance on the equipment.

Emerson North project south of Waterbury should start construction this month.

Brian discussed the NRCS EWP flood projects, two of the projects need Right-of-Way. As soon as the documents are signed, we can award the projects to the lowest bidder that has bid the Group 2 projects. One landowner has already signed the easement and the agreement will be put on July's agenda.

Highway Superintendent Arnold Mellick presented the road studies that were completed in Hooker Township.

- 1. Site #1- Beginning at the SE corner of Section 29 & the SW corner of Section 28, northeast of the corner of 578 Avenue and 889 Road, in Sections 32, running north and east in Sections 29, 28 and 27, Hooker Township and continuing east and ending between Sections 27 & 34 at Turkey Creek Road, Hooker Township 32, Range 4 East of the 6th Principal Meridian, Dixon County, Nebraska, is in the river.
- 2. Site #2 A portion of a road between 577 & 578 Avenues in Section 17, Township 31, Range 4 East of the 6th Principal Meridian, Dixon County, Nebraska, there is no sign of a road.

- 3. Site #3 A portion of a road between Highway 15 and 580 Avenue in Section 3, Township 31, Range 4 East of the 6th Principal Meridian, Dixon County, Nebraska, there is no sign of a road except for an old cut in the pasture.

Motion was made by Peterson to sign an agreement for purchase of easement right-of-way from Justin & Jamin Kay for EWP project 201770-415, seconded by Nicholson. On roll call vote: M.C.U. Absent: None.

Motion was made by Peterson to sign an agreement for purchase of easement right-of-way from Card Farms, LLC for EWP project 201770-413, seconded by Nicholson. On roll call vote: M.C.U. Absent: None.

Arnold Mellick, Dixon County Highway Supt. stated that NIRMA stressed that we are not to do any work on the state right-of-way. Work on 587 Avenue needs ditch work on the state ROW. Arnie had a sight visit with NDOT and they will work on getting a project together.

Midwest Engineering, Inc. submitted quotes for Fracture Critical and Regular bridge inspections. The total cost for 8 Fracture Critical inspections was quoted as \$11,850.00. Regular inspections were quoted at \$6,495.00. JEO quoted \$9,600.00 for fracture critical inspections. Mark Casey & Randy Stromberg do regular inspections for \$4,880.00. Motion was made by Anderson to engage JEO for the fracture critical inspections and Mark Casey & Randy Stromberg for regular inspections. Seconded by Mackling. On roll call vote: M.C.U. Absent: None.

Doug Ellis updated the Board on spraying township, state and county roads. He charges the state \$90.00 hr. plus chemical. County and Townships are charged \$25.00 hr. plus chemical. State law requires that all noxious weeds be sprayed. Townships have to request spraying brush.

Dan Alexander, MEI, sent an update on bridges 210P (Nelson) and 12405P (Schieffer). Field surveys have been completed and wetland permitting is scheduled.

Shea Scollard, Emergency Manager, handed out maps of bridge locations and bridges under 20'. Chair Lunz will put the ranks on the map also.

Bengtson bridge money has been allocated by NEMA. They have to approve the projects we want to use. NEMA is coming up July 21st to inspect the projects from the 2018 & 2019 flood events.

The Hazard Mitigation Plan has been completed. It will be submitted for approval at the August meeting.

Shea & Sara met with Laurel, Concord & Dixon fire districts regarding EMS mapping for GeoComm. There was a fire chiefs meeting in Newcastle last week.

The LEOP (Local Emergency Operations Plan) is being rewritten.

Sara Kumm, 911 Director, stated that the Statewide Radio System has been ordered. She is waiting on 1 camera to arrive before they can install them. She was awarded a grant for 8 AED units. They have a 4-year battery and AED pads with free replacement. The cabinets have arrived and will be installed by the road guys on a rainy day. Training will be held in the next couple of months. Training dummies will be supplied.

FOBS for the front and back doors will be installed at the end of this month.

Two new dispatchers/jailers have been hired.

Sara handed out a grant breakdown for 2020-2021. Total grant expenditures equaled \$267,934.02 grants covered \$262,452.68 of that cost, so the total cost to the county was \$5,481.34.

Deputy Blatchford, Union President, sent a letter to the Board updating them on the status of the new union. They are in the legal process of decertification with the CWA. As soon as that process is complete, they want to begin negotiations with the County and The Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #91.

The Safety Committee met on July 12, 2021 at 8:30 A.M. There were no accidents to report. Tornado shelters are still being looked at for the road sheds. Sara Kumm is certified in CPR/AED, First Aid and Stop the Bleed training and will be setting up and conducting training once the AED's are delivered. Safety Committee recommendations were submitted as follows – Don Andersen will attend the next Ponca City Council meeting





regarding the deep gutter on the east side of the Courthouse, also, there is a hole around the outside of the frame on the Clerk of District Court's vault window that needs fixed.

A letter was received from the Allen American Legion Post recommending Scott Morgan be appointed as the Emerson area Veteran's Service Committee member since he took over the duties of Dan Boeshart. Peterson made a motion to accept the recommendation, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: M.C.U. Absent: None.

Dixon County's NIRMA Crime Policy with regard to bonding of County Officials was approved on a motion by Anderson and second by Blohm. On roll call vote, M.C.U. Absent: None

A motion was made by Mackling, seconded by Blohm to allow the disposition of non-working equipment from the Janitor. The list is on file at the County Clerk's office. On roll call vote: M.C.U. Absent: None.

Notice was given to the Board of the sale of 2 desks from the County Clerk's office from inventory that was approved for disposal.

At 10:50 Chair Lunz called for a 10-minute break.

The Board recessed to meet as Board of Equalization, and reconvened with all members present.

The Board reconvened as Board of Supervisors at 11:08 A.M. with all members present.

The auditor requested an intergovernmental agreement for detention services between Thurston and Dixon County. After discussion, motion was made by Andersen to enter into the agreement with Thurston County for detention services, seconded by Nicholson. On roll call vote: M.C.U. Absent: None.

Timeclocks have not been installed yet. We have been waiting on CenturyLink to run cable to the Wakefield road shop. They are supposed to contact the County Clerk today with the status of the installation. If they haven't gotten it done, the County Clerk will contact Applied Connective and have the other 2 timeclocks installed and have Wakefield's done at a later date.

Supervisors Blohm and Mackling updated the Board on their new hires. They hired James Watkins, Jr. and Zach Harder but still need another blade operator. They would like to hire Mike Lindahl back but may have to offer him more. No one had a problem with hiring him at a higher rate.

Offering a maintainer training course was discussed. The Board directed the County Clerk to contact LTAP for the free training.

There was discussion on implementing the NIRMA Road Dept. Manual. This would address record keeping for signs, culverts etc.

The Board toured the jail.

The Board took a break for lunch at 12:00 P.M. and reconvened at 1:00 P.M. with all members present.

County Attorney, Leland Miner was present to discuss legal concerns of the Board.

The Discussion regarding employee emergency responder time off during working hours was addressed. There was concern regarding injury while on a rescue call. NIRMA stated that when the pager goes off, they would be on the fire/rescue dept. insurance. Motion was made by Mackling to establish a policy that employees can respond to emergency calls during working hours, with approval from a supervisor, but will not be paid for time away from the job, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: M.C.U. Absent: None.

County Attorney, Leland Miner, informed the Board that the County does not need a Dangerous Dog resolution after consulting the County Sheriff. The County can follow state statute.

Sheriff Decker met with the Mayor's of Ponca and Newcastle regarding law enforcement for their entities. He is working on an estimate of expenses for each of them. He will attend their council meetings with the proposal.

The meeting to determine final levy allocations for misc. subdivisions was set for August 24, 2021 at 9:00 A.M.

County Attorney, Leland Miner, Assessor, Amy Watchorn, County Clerk, Cindy Purucker, Treasurer, JoAnn Brennan, & Clerk of District Court, Jackie King-Coughlin met with the Board to discuss budget expectations with regard to salary increases for Courthouse employees. Leland Miner told the Board that the County officials met on June 18th to discuss cost of living increases for their employees. The CPI for May was 5% and in June rose to 5.5% due to the rise in cost of living. The officials recommended a proposed raise of





\$1.00 hr. for employees. The road employees are still in union negotiations so no recommended wage was given.

Motion was made by Blohm to approve the proposed wage increase of \$1.00 hr. for cost of living for courthouse employees, seconded by Anderson. On roll call vote: M.C.U. Absent: None.

Chair Lunz handed out budget information for our budget discussion.

Chair Lunz called for a Special Meeting on July 27th at 9:00 A.M. to talk about the budget.

The County Treasurer's Six-Month Report was approved on a motion by Nicholson and second by Mackling. On roll call vote, M.C.U. Absent: None.

The County Official's Fee Reports and Treasurer's List of Pledged Securities were approved on a motion by Nicholson and second by Andersen. On roll call vote, M.C.U. Absent: None.

Committee Reports – information was obtained on a transit service like Cedar County has. Funding is paid for by the County and reimbursed by the State & Federal Government at a certain percentage depending on the area. The Board directed the County Clerk to see what Cedar County has for expenses and reimbursement rate.

The County Clerk was informed by a gravel vendor that Nebraska Government entities purchasing in South Dakota are not tax exempt because Nebraska does not exempt South Dakota governmental entities. The County Clerk called the Nebraska Dept. of Revenue and they told her that is true. Nebraska does not exempt South Dakota governmental entities from sales tax. It would take action by the legislature to change the regulation. Per the State Auditor's office, we are not to pay sales tax at all.

Chair Lunz informed the Board that Mike at NACO is available to explain health insurance at no cost.

Supervisor Anderson has had complaints about the bad shape of the Newcastle Township roads. He said that residents were invited to come to the Board meeting to give their input. Deric has talked to the township chair and their board about the issue.

Chair Lunz will be setting up meetings with the townships soon to go over the road map and any assistance agreements they may want.

Motion was made by Nicholson, seconded by Blohm to approve the minutes of the July 13th and the July 27th meetings as written. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Dixon County Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and Engineer, Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Discussion was had on the bridge map and bridge inspections.

Brian McDonald, County Engineer, updated the Board on the Emerson North county line FHW project. The Army Corps of Engineers will not authorize removal of old building debris that is downstream from the bridge. Brian thought that the bridge letting will be later this fall.

Brian recommended that County Clerk be authorized to advertise for bids for the culvert installation on the Dixon NE project. Motion was made by Mackling, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Brian also recommended the County Clerk be authorized to advertise for bids for the removal of the Bengsten bridge. Motion was made by Peterson, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: M.C.U. Absent: None. Brian also stated that FEMA will have to approve the removal of the bridge and the Nelson bridge replacement.

Brian quoted SI&A routine bridge inspections at \$200.00 a bridge. He figured 52 bridges for a total of \$10,400.00.

The Newcastle SW box culvert project has a waterline in the county right-of-way. The City of Newcastle will have to relocate the waterline. Deric will work with Brian on getting right-of-way acquired.

The Dixon NE, Schutte culvert project, will need dirt, discussion was had on possible sites or have the contractor supply the dirt. The cost of the project would be less if the County can supply the dirt.

Brian is ordering the plans for the Echtenkamp box culvert from NDOT.

All EWP project sites are completed.

The road realignment south of Martinsburg needs sloping and fine grading done. Brian only received one quote from Milo Meyer Construction for \$10,000.00. They will be using a GPS motor grader for the fine grading. Neil Blohm will contact the construction company and coordinate their start date.

First Aid, AED, Stop the Bleed and CPR training for the road departments and courthouse personnel will be held in January or February.


