### DIXON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS PROCEEDINGS

The first regular meeting of the Dixon County Board of Supervisors for the year 2022 convened at 9:00 A.M. for reorganization in the Jury Room in the Dixon County Courthouse in Ponca, Nebraska on January 11, 2022. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Notice was given to the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Law. The following constitutes the Dixon County Board of Supervisors for 2022:

On roll call, members present were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Lisa Lunz, Deric Anderson, and Roger Peterson. Absent: None. Also present were Cindy Purucker, Dixon County Clerk and Secretary to the Board of Supervisors and other interested persons.

Lisa Lunz, Chair of the 2021 Board asked for a motion to appoint a Temporary Chair. Motion was made by Nicholson, seconded by Blohm to appoint Neil Blohm as Temporary Chairman. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Temporary Chairman Blohm asked for nominations from the Board for Chairman for 2022. Nicholson made motion to nominate Lisa Lunz, seconded by Andersen. Motion was made by Peterson, seconded by Nicholson that nominations cease, and a unanimous ballot be cast for Lisa Lunz as chair for 2022. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Lunz abstained.

Chair Lunz called for nominations of Vice-Chair. Peterson nominated Neil Blohm as Vice-Chair, seconded by Nicholson. Motion by Peterson that nominations cease, and a unanimous ballot be cast for Neil Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Neil Blohm was appointed as Vice-Chair for 2022.


Motion was made by Andersen, seconded by Blohm to show by the records that this meeting was preceded by due and legal notice by posting as required by law in the Bank of Dixon County, bulletin board in the lower hall of the courthouse, bulletin board in the County Clerk's Office, the Dixon County website and two County newspapers, and all Board Members were notified simultaneously and the agenda of all known business to come before the Board of Supervisors was posted in the office of the County Clerk. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Motion was made by Peterson, seconded by Nicholson to approve the minutes of the last meeting as written. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

After discussion of the committees, the following appointments were made:

Motion was made by Peterson, seconded by Blohm to approve the Committees for 2022. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan





Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. The person whose name heads the list of each Committee is designated as the Chairman of that Committee (23-272).

The regular meeting of the Board shall be held on the second Tuesday of January. All other meetings are adjourned meetings.

Part-time Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and County Engineer Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian McDonald updated the Board on the progress on the Emerson North FHW bridge. The letting is tentatively set for February. He also updated the status of the last of the FEMA projects.

Martinsburg SW project that relocated 583.5 road south of highway 20 has been opened, the land for the old road will revert back to the adjacent landowner.

At 9:30 A.M. bids were opened for the Wakefield West and Newcastle Southwest projects. The bids were as follows:

A&R Construction Co. – Wakefield West - \$218,302.44 with a start date of November 2022. No bid for Newcastle SW.

Dixon Construction Co. – Newcastle SW - \$746,324.75 with a start date of September 6, 2022. No bid for Wakefield West.

Engineer McDonald recommended the Board accept the bids pending a review of the numbers. Motion to accept the low bids pending a review of the numbers was made by Nicholson, seconded by Anderson. On roll call vote. Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Discussion was had on a new driveway resolution. It was agreed to extend the culvert width to forty foot and anything in excess of that width will be at the expense of the landowner. Motion was made to adopt the resolution by Anderson, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. On a motion by Peterson and second by Anderson to appoint Shea Scollard as Emergency Manager and Sara Kumm as 911 Director. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Shea Scollard was appointed as primary rep. and Sara Kumm as alternate rep. to the Northeast Regional Governance Board for the Northeast Planning, Exercise, Training & Interoperable Communications Region, and a Memorandum of Understanding for the Northeast Region Planning Committee approved on a motion by Andersen and second by Blohm. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. **Resolution and Ordinance Book 3 Page 177.** 

The Emergency Management Performance Review for EMPG grant guidelines were tabled until next month. They will be completed by Chair Lunz after interviews are completed.

Shea Scollard and Sara Kumm were present to give Emergency Management Updates. Shea told the Board the FEMA projects are still in the approval process. Cyber training program is still running. The EMPG audit is scheduled for next week. There will be grain bin training with the area fire/rescue personnel.

Sara Kumm informed the Board that she has been working on the Statewide Radio System. We will be able to use the wireless money to pay the expenses. NextGen 911 equipment is coming in. The interlocal agreement for the NextGen911 is being rewritten again. EMS lines were received from Cedar and Dakota Counties for the mapping system.



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A grant from NIRMA for \$970.11 to defray the cost of winter safety coats was received. Sara is going to apply for a grant to replace the deputy radios and handheld radios.

Supervisor Blohm made a motion to approve Change Order #3 for the Ponca SE project, seconded by Nicholson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Don Andersen stated he is on the Ponca City agenda this month to discuss the gutter east of the courthouse.

Motion was made by Mackling seconded by Peterson to allow the Allen Road shop to dispose of nonfunctioning items on their inventory. A list is on file at the County Clerk's office. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Nicholson made motion to approve the sale of a 2004 Freightliner at the Taylor & Martin auction on January 20<sup>th</sup>. Seconded by Peterson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Application from Bank First and NPAIT to be approved as a County Depository for 2022 were reviewed. Motion was made by Peterson, seconded by Blohm to adopt resolutions approving Bank First, Wakefield, NE and NPAIT as County Depositories for 2022. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. **Resolution & Ordinance Book 3 Pages 178 and 180**.

The County Treasurer was authorized to invest monies not needed for day-to-day operations in bonds, etc. on a motion by Nicholson and second by Blohm. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The mileage reimbursement rate change to .585 cents per mile effective January 1, 2022 was approved on a motion by Blohm and a second by Anderson. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The County Treasurer's Six-Month Report was reviewed.

The County Official's Fee Reports and Treasurer's List of Pledged Securities were approved on a motion by Nicholson and second by Andersen. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Correspondence was reviewed.

Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality notified the County Clerk that the Scrap Tire Grant for 2022 was denied. Cedar County will be holding an event that will include Dixon County. We will be notified of when their event is.

Discussion was had on appointing a shop/road foreman for each road shop. A majority of the supervisors agreed it was good to have someone to oversee the day-to-day duties. The foreman would make .50 over the highest paid road employee. They would not have the ability to hire or fire but can make recommendations to the supervisors based on job performance. The Allen shop is ready to appoint a shop/road foreman, but the Newcastle shop is not. Supervisor Anderson made a motion to approve a shop/ road foreman as warranted at the discretion of the supervisors, seconded by Mackling. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.



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Chair Lunz would like to have Pam Bourne or Zelle give a presentation on best employment practices. Cathy Stilwell, payroll clerk, was present to answer questions regarding the time clocks. The Board would like to have a meeting with the road employees on protocol before going live with the time clocks. Potentially we will go strictly to time clock on February 20, 2022.

JoAnn Brennan, County Treasurer, visited with the Board about data fees she is collecting. Currently we are charging fees to escrow companies that are also being charged by MIPS for the same information. Most counties do not charge the data fees anymore. Supervisor Nicholson made a motion to discontinue charging for data fees from the escrow companies that are being charged fees by MIPS. Seconded by Peterson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The Board recessed to meet as Board of Equalization and reconvened with all members present. The Board made their quarterly tour of the jail.

The Board recessed for lunch at 12:00 P.M and reconvened at 1:00 P.M with all members present. County Attorney, Leland Miner was present to discuss legal concerns of the Board.

An estray claim was filed with the county. Leland Miner explained what an estray claim is. Roger Schindler was present to request a continuance on paying the claim. Attorney Miner told Mr. Schindler that he can pursue the case as a civil matter if he does not agree with the Boards decision. The Board discussed the claim.

Supervisor Peterson made a motion to authorize the County Treasurer to pay the estray claim to George Koch for \$520.00 for feed and damages, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. The balance held in the Estray Fund is to be paid to Mr. Schindler.

Resolutions were discussed on the assumption of maintenance of township roads in Hooker and Newcastle Townships. The Newcastle Township Road is 587 Avenue from north of Highway 12 to 883 Road in between sections 35 & 36, Township 31 North, Range 5 East. The Hooker Township roads are approximately 4.5 miles beginning on 882 Road and proceeding east from 577 Avenue to 580 Avenue; then North on 580 Avenue to 883 Road; then East one mile on 883 Road to 583 Avenue; all in Township 31 North, Range 4 East.

Anderson made motion to approve the resolution for the assumption of roads in Newcastle Township, seconded by Peterson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Resolution & Ordinance Book 3, Page 183.

Anderson made motion to approve the resolution for the assumption of roads in Hooker Township, seconded by Lunz. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Resolution & Ordinance Book 3, Page 185.

There were no bids for the windows and pass-through tray for the Assessor's and Treasurer's offices. Dylan Glaser with CP Strategies gave a presentation on the Summit CO2 pipeline.

Discussion was had on the courthouse/jail assessment. The next phase deals with preliminary plans and appointing a citizens committee if we move forward. Nicholson made motion to move forward with Phase II, seconded by Anderson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Discussion was had on mowing of county roads. Since it is already a law there would be no need to pass a resolution. According to State Statute 39-1811. Landowners are responsible for mowing the roads adjacent to their property. The only time mowing will be done is when it is late in the year and there is a chance of snow





drifting onto the roadway. Landowners will be notified there has been a change in policy. Motion was made by Anderson, seconded by Mackling to follow state statute for mowing roads. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Discussion was had on an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Ponca for monitoring of police, fire and rescue telephone and radio calls for the City of Ponca by the Sheriff's Department for a fee. Motion was made by Peterson and seconded by Anderson to adopt the agreement and present it to the City of Ponca for approval. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Safety Committee recommendations were submitted. The south shed would like more than two electrical outlets. Supervisor Blohm is looking into having some more installed.

The Sheriff's 2021 Activity Report was reviewed.

The Noxious Weed deposited \$15,691.50 last month.

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

Updating the bridge map was touched on.



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

The Cedar County paging project is progressing. A test repeater is being hooked up in Hartington to help with boosting the signal. If that works, the project will be complete.

The grant application for the ARPA funds was discussed. Applications for radios and handheld radios will be handed out to the fire departments in the county at the chiefs meeting in April. Sara has sent an application in to the Gardner Foundation to see if they could help offset the cost for the fire/rescue departments.

A Summit project update was given by Ben Fuller and Dan Plume. They are in the design, permitting & ROW acquisition stages. There will be 11.6 miles of line in Dixon County. There have been six ethanol plants in Nebraska sign up to use the pipeline. Routing is almost complete. An estimated start date would be in the second quarter of 2023.

The Board recessed to meet as Board of Equalization and reconvened with all members present.

Sheriff Tom Decker told the Board that the City of Ponca has not yet approved dispatching. He has talked to Police Chief Joe Yokum and he had visited with the City's attorney and the Ponca City Board. They may be a little more receptive to an agreement for a dispatching and mutual aid agreement.

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

Dixon County Engineer, Brian McDonald and part time Highway Supt. Arnold Mellick were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects.

The bid for Emerson North and Martinsburg East projects were awarded. Since the bids from Two Rivers was submitted without start dates the County Attorney stated that it was a deviation from the requirements of the bid documents. The bids should be considered as nonresponsive bids and be rejected. Brian McDonald recommended that the bids be given to the next low bidders. Emerson North to Husker Engineering and Martinsburg East to Krusemark Construction & Excavation. Motion was made by Nicholson that the bids be awarded as recommended and seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Brian stated that Emerson North county line bridge has a start date of September 6, 2022. Discussion was had on rehabbing bridge number 405 north of Maskell on 888 Road. Brian said that multiple beams and more piling could be added to widen the bridge to 20 feet and the wood deck would need replaced by a concrete deck. The cost of the project would be between \$250,000 and \$300,000. This would up the tonnage on the bridge. The project will be added to the 1&6 Year Road Plan next month. The bridge rehab could be let in the next couple of months for a spring construction date.

Brian mentioned that the Krusemark bridge should be a 40-foot bridge. The Dixon NE project will be completed after the fiber optics are moved. Project C-26(311) Crooked bridge project can be moved down the list.

The Board reviewed the Inter-local Agreement for the Veterans Service Office with Dakota County. A motion to execute a contract for another year was made by Peterson, seconded by Andersen. A mock drill for hazmat training was held. FEMA is looking at the last two projects for approval. Bird Flu composting is almost completed. There were 1.7 million birds in Dixon County lost to bird flu. The area fire chiefs meeting was held and applications for ARPA grants were handed out.



MIPS can give the information directly to the state printshop instead of getting the information to another printer by hand. County Attorney Leland Miner met with the board to discuss county legal business.



Mr. Miner read a motion to deny the petition of Carl Kneifl for an access road to his property in Section 13, Township 31, Range 5 East of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. for the following reasons:

- 1. The property was isolated at the time he acquired ownership; therefore, the requirements of section 39-1716(1)(b) is not satisfied.
- 2. The evidence presented does not establish that the isolation of the land was not caused by Carl Kneifl or anyone else and therefore section 39-1716(1)(c) is not satisfied.
- 3. The petition is virtually the same as the prior petitions filed in 2008 & 2009.
- 4. That the petition is for similar relief in the District Court Case No. CI09-42 that denied the petition with prejudice and that reconsideration of the same issue, absent new evidence is not available and is barred by the doctrine of Res Judicata
- 5. No new evidence was presented
- 6. Evidence presented at the hearing on May 10, 2022 does not meet the requirements of Nebraska Revised Statutes section 39-1713 and 39-1716.

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Motion was made to deny the petition of Carl Kneifl by Nicholson, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. He and Sara are getting quotes on radios for the fire department radios for their ARPA grant submissions. Sara stated that the request for matching funds from the Gardener Foundation was denied. She will continue to look for other funding sources and grants. Shea is still working with FEMA on the flood projects. As the projects are completed, he is turning in the documentation. Sara attended Certified Training Officer training; her second certification is completed. She still needs EMD & Dispatch Supervisor certifications.

Sara stated that Statewide Radio is coming to the NE Region in two weeks. Emergency Medical dispatch has been approved. She is getting a medical director. The Newcastle tower is being repaired this week. The support cables, brackets and the antenna were damaged by the Derecho in May. She is looking into setting up the towers for routine inspections per insurance requirements.

Sara handed out a grant breakdown for 2021-2022. Total grant expenditures equaled \$43,930.81 grants covered \$35,553.50 of that cost, so the total cost to the county was \$7,222.75.

Since completion of the road map there are two roads that were not on the map and need named. The first is off 878 Road going to Ketter's. Discussion with Shea & Sara have determined that it should be named 5925 Avenue. The other road is off Highland Road going into the Schram property. The determination is that this road should be named 8825 Road. Motion was made by Blohm to name those roads accordingly and add them to the 911 map. Seconded by Hassler. The Board discussed the protocol for violation of that statute. 1. If the road has not been mowed after the July 15<sup>th</sup> deadline a letter will be sent by the County to the landowner. 2. If after 2 weeks there is non-compliance the County Attorney can file a complaint and the landowner can be cited for the violation. 3. If the County has to go mow the road a fee can be assessed against the property. 4. The fee for the violation will be \$200.00 per machine hour with a minimum charge of 1 hour from the time they leave the shop. 

Annette Sudbeck, NRD, Taylor Letexier, NRCS soil specialist and Curtiss Armstrong, NRD Board, were present to discuss flood concerns and impacts on flooding to the City of Ponca. Annette told the Board that the South Creek Watershed has almost 250,000 acres in their watershed. It all drains into South Creek and ultimately into the AOWA Creek. Annette stated that there are funds through PIFR for a feasibility study which the NRD would be the program sponsor. They asked the county if they could see the need and would support the first step. Annette also stated that she will be visiting with the Ponca City Council in the future. The consensus of the Board was to support the benefits of the first step of a feasibility study for watershed needs.





It was recommended to put on a skim coat of mortar before waterproofing. The floor joists in the crawl space in the old part of the courthouse are rotting. There were three options discussed. Option one was controlling the moisture in the crawl space under the old part of the courthouse by laying a moisture and vapor barrier over the dirt and up the walls. Option two, includes option one and to waterproof the east wall and encapsulate the moisture to prevent mold, improve the air quality, and install a sump pump system for drainage. Option three included all of the above and stabilize the floors under the Assessor's office with steel beams to replace the ones that are dry rotted.

At 10:50 A.M. the Board took a 10-minute break and reconvened at 11:00 A.M.



### **DIXON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS PROCEEDINGS**

The Dixon County Board of Supervisors met on September 13, 2022 at 9:00 A.M. for an adjourned meeting in the Jury Room in the Dixon County Courthouse in Ponca, Nebraska. Chair Lisa Lunz opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and called for roll call of members present. Answering were: Don Andersen, Terry Nicholson, Steve Hassler, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson and Lisa Lunz. Absent: Neil Blohm. Also present were Cindy Purucker, Dixon County Clerk and Secretary to the Board of Supervisors and other interested persons. Chair Lunz gave notice to the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Law.

Motion was made by Andersen, seconded by Nicholson to show that this meeting was preceded by due and legal notice by posting as required by law in the Bank of Dixon County, bulletin board in the lower hall of the courthouse, bulletin board in the County Clerk's office and two County newspapers, and all Board Members were notified simultaneously and the agenda of all know business to come before the Board of Supervisors was posted in the office of the County Clerk. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Absent: Blohm.

Motion was made by Andersen, seconded by Nicholson to approve the minutes of the August 9<sup>th</sup> & August 25<sup>th</sup> meetings as written. On roll call vote Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Brian McDonald, County Engineer, was present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian stated that work has started on the Martinsburg E project. Supervisor Hassler stated that the bridge has been removed on the Emerson North county line project.

The Board reviewed the 2023 1&6 Year Road Plan. The County Clerk will coordinate with Highway Supt. Mellick to complete it for the hearing next month. There were no new projects to add.

Supervisor Peterson made a motion to hold the 1&6 Year Road Plan hearing on October 11, 2022 at 9:15 A.M., seconded by Hassler. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Absent: Blohm.

The road that leads from Highway 12 to Jerry Stewart's home in Hooker Township was named 577 Avenue at last month's meeting. 911 Director, Sara Kumm, was informed by gWorks that the road should have been named 887 Road. On the recommendation of Sara Kumm, 911 director, it was decided to rename the road 887 Road and to notify the residents on that road.

At 9:30 A.M. bids were opened for the Maskell North project. JEO project 220888.00. The bids were as follows:

Herbst Construction, Inc, LeMars, IA - \$669,190.00, shoofly included at \$78,200.00 with a start date 30 days after signed contract or 12-19-22.

Lincoln Midwest Infrastructure, Inc, Lincoln, NE - \$649,411.28, shoofly included at \$178,000.00 with a June 2023 start date.

Theisen Construction, Inc., Norfolk, NE - \$513,397.64, shoofly included at \$190,952.00 with a March 2023 start date.

Lincoln Midwest Infrastructure was present and they said that they can do the project without installing a shoofly. Brian McDonald will contact the other contractors as see if they could complete the project without the shoofly and that portion of the bid could be eliminated. He recommended that the Board table the awarding of the contract until the October meeting pending a review of the numbers. The Board agreed to table the award on the project until the October meeting.

Financing was discussed for the JD 772GP motor grader serial number 1DW772GPTNF715409. It was agreed to use the Bank of Dixon County for the interest rate of 2.8%. It will be designated as tax exempt financing. Motion was made by Peterson to authorize the Chair to sign the tax-exempt financing papers for the motor grader, seconded by Anderson. Emergency Manager, Shea Scollard was present to discuss ongoing projects. Missouri River Expo is this weekend and he is getting the dispatch/command center set up. National Night Out was held in Emerson. The windmill 911 addressing is done and submitted. He attended a flood meeting on the Logan Flood Plain. There will be a countywide drill in October for all the fire and rescue. Eastern Wildfire training is coming up. Kenwood and Motorola will be giving radio demonstrations to the fire departments for the ARPA grant. The goal is to have one handheld radio per truck and one handheld radio per fire chief with one repeater per fire department.

Sara Kumm, 911 Coordinator, stated that the Statewide Radio System counsel has been installed. The deputy radios will be programmed by the end of the month. The state OCIO will come out in mid-October to put the channels and id's in place. Emergency Medical Dispatch training will start at the end of October or first of November. United Communications repaired the Newcastle tower's wind damage.

Sara also needs the number of radios for the road department equipment & vehicles so she can have the chips installed.



The road would be closed approximately 2,656 feet south of the Highway 12 and 576 Avenue intersection and proceed south to the intersection of 576 Avenue & 886 Road.

Ken Lindberg, Obert, gave testimony and referenced the petition from Obert residents that was filed with both counties. The residents use the road to ride horses, jog, walk and use 4-wheelers.

Gerald Stewart, Maskell, gave testimony how dangerous and narrow the road is with the high banks. He also stated that if the road is closed, he would be paying taxes on the land which currently as a road is not being taxed.

Ken Lindberg gave a rebuttal and presented a map that shows how travelers were directed to use the road as a short cut from the two local cemeteries to get to Highway 12.

All Board members stated that it was probably not a very safe route to have travelers unfamiliar with the road to drive on it.

Deric Anderson, Dixon County Board and also a Hooker Township Board member stated that the road is only maintained twice a year and was just maintained last week. He also stated that the Township Board is okay with closing the road.

Chairman Bartels asked if there were any more comments.



Brian recommended that the board award the project to the low bidder without alternative #1, which would be Theisen Construction. 
Daily Township has a road they want the Board to take over. On the absence of Supervisor Anderson there was not enough information to make a decision. The Board will not make a decision at this time.







Brian said that the Martinsburg East project is almost complete.



Brian told the Board that the Emerson North county line bridge project is ready for the contractor to start. There will be a change order for the Newcastle SW box culvert for rock & geogrid.





The Emergency Operations book is almost ready to print. MIPS gave him protocols for their program that delayed the printing. GeoComm is going to print 1 large map of the roads. Dixon County was awarded the MPG grant again this year. The Waterbury siren grant was approved.

Sara Kumm, 911 coordinator, informed the Board that the deputy radios are in, they are waiting on the chargers. The repeaters are here and will be installed soon. She is working with the fire and recue units on grants for equipment through ARPA. The state was awarded \$24,000,000.00. Each fire dept. will be allotted so much money. The cost of fire and rescue equipment is extremely high, an ambulance costs \$300,000.00. NextGen911 is being installed this week in Cedar & Wayne Counties. Dixon County will be dispatching their calls while they are being updated. Dixon County is being updated the week after Thanksgiving. Sara handed out information on the total of fire and rescue calls for the last couple of years. The FCC license for the road radios has been approved. They will be coming in and be installed soon.

Discussion was had on renting space in Emerson for one of the maintainers during the winter months. Steve Hassler has talked to someone that is willing to rent to the county for \$250.00 a month. 


